RBOC Report - Paul Clausen, Vice President North

The legislation on the State level is winding through Committees and Public comment periods. We are tracking them and sending support letters when appropriate.

We're watching closely AB1183 the new "Operators" definition, AB1111 the Office of Sustainable Outdoor Recreation, SB393 the Vessel Impoundment bill, and AB1387 the bill for annual fishing licenses.

The effort to stop 15% Ethanol fuel that could damage both inboard and outboard motors at the National level is being fought with a call to action from RBOC and Boats US. Please join the fight to prevent the sale of 15% Ethanol by going to http://bit.ly/2UyyMFV.

The Flare Turn In project for the disposal of out of date flares (both hand held and aerial) has had enough success that the program is being expanded, but so far just in Bay area locations. We are pushing for a Delta location flare disposal.

A bill that would have made the Delta Stewardship Council more fair has failed in committee. The bill would have added four members, all from Delta counties. As it stands, there are 7 voting members and only one is from a Delta county.

A large issue that is not local is more difficult to track and handle. In Southern California, we are fighting the potential further regulation of copper based bottom paint. Any regulation that passes anywhere in the State is likely to be adopted everywhere, whether necessary or not. The regulation could be very costly as the current replacement paints are very expensive and have limited effectiveness.

RBOC is on watch to help and protect the boaters of California.

Slips, Trips, and Falls - Safety Officer Pat Carson

What are the main causes of slips, trips and falls on your vessel? Our boats present a unique environment for the preventions of accidents. Safety challenges include deck surfaces that are not even or level, precipitation from the weather, spray from the sea, and the natural pitching and rolling motion of the vessel. According to USCG statistics, nearly half of all reported accidents on vessels are the result of a slip, trip or fall. One cause of slips is liquid on a deck making an unexpected location slippery. Think about our cool mornings this time of year where the moisture in the air has condensed on our boat deck. Areas that when dry provide good traction are now slippery and provide poor traction. Trips are usually caused by changes in elevation, an unexpected transition, or an unseen object. All of our boats have unique deck transitions; sometimes just a few inches is a trip hazard. You might know where these are on your boat, but do your guests? Falls can occur when climbing that ladder to the flybridge or down into the engine room. Carrying heavy objects up and down steep stairs or ladders can be difficult, especially if the vessel is underway.

Here are some easy ways to help prevent slips, trips and falls:

- 1. Keep the decks clean and clear.
- 2. Clean up any water, liquids, or debris on the decks immediately and dry if necessary.
- 3. When moving around the outer decks use handholds and move slowly and deliberately.
- 4. Never carry a load in front of you that does not allow clear visibility of each step.
- 5. Keep the companionways clear of objects.

In addition, do not forget that many of the same hazards are present on the docks. Safe boating.




