RBOC Report - Paul Clausen

RBOC has been busy preparing for the new legislative year and all of our housekeeping issues. We had a Board meeting at the beautiful Half Moon Bay Yacht Club on January 9th to plan the year ahead, assign members to our internal committees, and make sure we are all on the same page with club assignments.

Each RBOC Director is responsible for communicating the important issues concerning the boating community to as many as fifteen yacht clubs in their geographic area. It is a daunting job, as just getting the right people together for a meeting is often very difficult. It is, however, fun and interesting. Talking about common issues and learning about other clubs and their concerns has been a fascinating experience.

When I write my next article, we will have visited with Senators and Assemblypersons in their offices in Sacramento. It is so early in the process I do not yet know what the biggest issues will be. We do know that two bills Governor Brown vetoed twice will likely be put on the new Governor's desk for signature. A bill further defining the word "operator" will be advanced by the California State Sheriff's Association. Another will limit chemicals used in holding tanks and waste systems. More bills are being advanced as I write but it is too early to tell what the final wording will be.

RBOC will be watching all of the bills proposed as well as other activities of State Government agencies and commissions. We are also watching for and commenting on lawsuits mounted against yacht clubs, marine vendors, boatyards, and marinas to be sure they are fair and not just a frivolous money grab.

Make-A-Wish Update - Ed Stetson

At the February meeting your Board authorized a Make-A-Wish fundraising event for 2019. Stay tuned for the details as they are developed. But save the date: AUGUST 17th.

Safety Day 2019 Safety Day 2019 - Pat Carson

A day full of hits and a few misses.

Hit: We had a record turn out with 38 vessels participating in the courtesy vessel safety checks that are now part of the requirements for berthing at the Stockton Yacht Club.

Hit: All boats inspected passed, sort of. We had two boats that would have failed due to a non-compliant item, not having the required original vessel documentation or registration onboard. Sorry, photocopies are not acceptable, not even those done on a high quality color printer. If I can tell it's not the original, it will not pass muster with the professionals. Both berthers were given a pass on the promise to bring the original documentation to the vessel and keep it there.

Hit: Daytime and night time pyrotechnic visual distress signals are not required for vessels operating on inland waters. There were quite a few owners with expired flares on board their boats but given they meet the aforementioned "inland water" test, in service flares were not required.

Miss: If you operate your vessel on coastal waters, the Great Lakes, or any body of water with a passageway to the sea more than 2 miles wide, **then** you must carry 3 daytime and 3 nighttime or 3 combination day/night pyrotechnic devices. If you never plan on going outside of San Francisco Bay then you can skip the flares.

Hit: USCG Boatswain's Mate First Class Tony Kopshever held a great discussion on being boarded by the USCG or other law enforcement agencies. A lot of good information was presented on what to expect and some do's and don'ts when the orange boat comes alongside and wants to come aboard.

Hit: A \$5.00 lunch. Fifty some folks joined us for the best \$5 lunch anywhere. Gourmet chili from a great Napa hot spot and a variety of hot dogs to please every taste. There were polish dogs, Nathan's dogs, beef dogs, turkey dogs, and garlic sausages on the menu along with a variety of chips and ice cream sandwiches for dessert. It was yummy!
