### RBOC Report - Paul Clausen, Vice President North

The legislative season is winding down and a few proposed bills are still in the mix. AB 1111, a bill authorizing a new "Office of Sustainable Outdoor Recreation", is on the floor for passage. RBOC supports the bill but has testified and submitted a brief indicating that it not take dollars from the Division of Boating and Waterways budget, and we would like a seat on any advisory committee.

SB 393 is a bill that would impound boats involved in fatal accidents and the boat operator is alcohol or drug impaired. RBOC wanted marina operators that had to store these boats to be held harmless should anything happen to the boat while impounded. They have added that provision to SB 393 and we support the bill as it is now written.

I am on an extended East Coast vacation and will miss some important meetings on the Delta Conveyance, which is the new terminology for the tunnel. Our good friend Bill Wells and RBOC Past President Peter Robertson will attend the meeting. We will be well represented and let's hope the report is favorable to the Delta community.

Delta Conveyance financing is ongoing with many public agencies deciding how much money they can spend on the projects construction and maintenance. Hard to do without numbers, but that's the way they are proceeding. It's hard for me to hear the Mojave Water District talk about how much Delta water they deserve.

I'll be back for the Division of Boating and Waterways budget meeting. We can hope it will not be cut too much as Parks and Recreation works through its priorities.
